John Kyle

John Kyle is a professional sports commentator and voiceover artist, specialising in equestrianism. He will be the equestrian commentator for the TV world-feed from the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, a role he also undertook at the Rio and Tokyo Games and he was an on-site commentator at London 2012 Games. He has also been on the microphone at numerous other high-profile championships and events and been the lead commentator for the live broadcast of the Kentucky Three Day event since 2014.

John started commentating when he was in his late teens and worked live on site at events and for television alongside studying at Glasgow and Cambridge and later while holding various positions in the British Army and in events administration.

In the summer of 2011 John decided to turn his hobby into a full-time profession and commit to building a strong portfolio of commentating work. Now based in London, he travels all over Britain and internationally, particularly for regular work in the USA and Europe working closely with event organisers and National and International Sports Federations.

For television, John has acted as the main commentator for sports coverage on BBC, RTÉ (Ireland), Regional ITV, NBC and CBS (United States), Sky Sports and Discovery-Eurosport. In addition he is a stalwart of equestrianism's specialist broadcasters; FEltv, Horse & Country and Clip My Horse.

John has provided voiceover services to major companies like SAP, Gartner, Cisco. He has commissioned and produced promotional video content for companies including Mars and Land Rover. In 2022 he acted as a producer for the 32 commentators delivering the world-feed from the Beijing Winter Olympics.



About the day

Having worked in major events and broadcast productions for nearly 30 years - including during the increasing move of niche sports from traditional broadcasters to online platforms - I felt I could offer some useful advice to others in the industry.

The day isn't designed to coach participants in **how** to commentate but hopefully to offer some ways in which everyone can become a better, more professional member of the industry.

Similarly an open discussion of the "business" of commentary is designed to help achieve a level and equitable playing-field for those entering and advancing in the broadcast space.

Those invited already have some experience behind the microphone so the day will run as quite an open discussion on the topics drawing on each attendees specialisations and experiences.
